

Drones for disaster management – a valuable tool



General capabilities



Current legal framework in Germany

- Since April 2017 <u>new legal regulation</u> on UAV operations with specific exceptions for public authorities and relief organisations
- No permission necessary:
 - Flight with devices up to 25 kg
 - Beyond visual line of sight
 - Over crowd
 - Over sensitive areas (e.g. critical infrastructures, government buildings, etc.)
 - Higher than 100m


No implementing regulation available for civil protection users

Network of partners


























General situation



Requirements for joint regulations


- Agreed by all major organisations
- Usable at all scenarios from single deployment to large scale crisis
- Define minimum standards for all users in civil protection
- Covers elementary topics:
 - Training
 - Risk management
 - Tactical approaches
 - Joint deployments
 - Legal framework




